Environmental Legacy Project



For her three-month internship (from February 1st to May 1st, 2010), Po-Yi has begun the Environmental Legacy Book Project for Volunteer Grandparents. She intends to help publish a collection of personal stories, reflections, and creative expression from volunteer grandparents, families, and children about their experience under our organization. The main purpose of the book is to illustrate the importance of intergenerational relationships to our well-being and our environment as a whole. It also comes from the idea that one might not start caring for the earth unless one begins caring for oneself and other fellow human beings.

The book may be used by members to share knowledge and wisdom amongst each other or may be used for future fundraising and promotional purposes. It meets the organization's vision *to bridge and enrich the generations*.
