I was asked to write a paragraph for the newsletter about the Volunteer Grandparents School Program and decided to share two different views. One is from a volunteer who has been reading with the children and another from the teacher who has 20 years experience with the program.

Gloria Brown is a volunteer in the School Grandparent Program at Grandview Elementary and shares her views on the benefits to all who participate:

She has been volunteering for three years and likes reading personally and feels it is an activity that everyone enjoys, given the opportunity. Gloria states "it is a pleasure to hear and watch a child read. The different expressions, the questions they ask while reading. The biggest reward is watching the growth in each student from September to June."

Gloria also takes the time to give credit where it is due by stating "The two teachers that I work with are treasures that the school is fortunate to have on staff."

Each student has been able to work in a small group or more often, in a one-to-one learning situation daily four days a week because of the wonderful volunteers who have been coming to our school for many years. They enjoy listening to children read and providing a safe, nurturing environment in which students are able to develop their skills.
